**DAY 5: Fukuoka, Japan.** Cosmopolitan Fukuoka (*Foo-koo-oh-ka*) features the Hakata Machiya Folk Museum, artisans creating the famed Hakata-ori cloth used for kimono (*obi*) sashes and sumo loincloths. Shop the Tenjin district for clay Hakata dolls or silk obi sashes. (B,L,D)

**DAY 6: Jeju, South Korea.** Just off the southern coast of the Korean peninsula is this idyllic isle that just may remind you of Hawaii. Jeju is a volcanic island dominated by Halla mountain and replete with spectacular waterfalls. Cheonjaeyon Waterfall is a breathtaking sight bathed in enchanted lore. (B,L,D)

**DAY 7: At Sea.** (B,L,D)

**DAY 8: Xiamen, China.** The name of this coastal city means "gate of China", and was voted China's cleanest city. Visit the Wushipu Oil Painting Village or the Haicang Oil Painting Village. (B,L,D)

**DAY 9: Hong Kong, China.** The most striking thing about Hong Kong is its pervasive mix of old and new. It is a study in contrasts that constantly surprises. Add the former British colony's strange brew of Asian and Western cultures to this endless series of odd contradictions. (B,L,D)

**DAYS 10-11: At Sea.** (B,L,D)

**DAY 12: Ho Chi Minh, Vietnam.** Often fast-paced, this city of seven million inhabitants is also innovative and sophisticated. Skyscrapers rise across the land-
