Here we go again! For our 21st Anniversary Cruise we've chosen the big and beautiful **Mariner of the Seas**! The **Mariner** is the largest cruise ship to sail from the Port of Galveston. The ship was overhauled in 2012 and features some of the grandeur found on the **Oasis** and **Allure**. You'll find new dining, exciting venues and dazzling shows! What a vacation!

DAY 1: Caribbean Bound. Enjoy a relaxing ride on our roomy coach to the Port of Galveston. Enjoy a comfort break at everyone's favorite, **Prasek's Smokehouse**.

Arrive Galveston and board the 138,000-gross ton **Mariner of the Seas**, your home for the next seven nights. You'll be treated to a lunch buffet, sumptuous dinner and introductory show as the ship sails silently in the Gulf of Mexico. (L,D)

DAY 4: George Town. Grand Cayman is one of a group of three magnificent tropical islands Christopher Columbus called "Las Tortugas" (the turtles) for the sea creatures he found in the ocean water. The designation did not endure, however, for on later maps the islands were labeled the Caimanau, the Carib Indian word for "crocodile." The name "Caimanas" refers inaccurately to the iguanas native to the islands, which were perhaps at one point mistaken for crocodiles. Among other attractions, visitors to the island will enjoy learning about the turtles, visiting the town of Hell, exploring Seven-Mile Beach and enjoying the undersea world. (B,L,D)

DAY 5: Falmouth. Quaint Falmouth was an economic powerhouse and center for dramatic social change during the English
